TRAVELLING TO EINDHOVEN AND BACK

The Netherlands is a small and densely populated country with an excellent public transport network. Wherever you want to go in the Netherlands, you can easily and comfortably get there by train, bus or metro. Read more about the major sights, tips for travelling on Dutch public transport and what type of ticket you will need to get around.

BY PLANE

Eindhoven Airport: To and from the airport

After Schiphol Amsterdam Airport, Eindhoven Airport is the Netherlands largest airport. It is located to the west of the city itself. From the airport, you can reach the city centre of Eindhoven in a matter of minutes. It is cheapest to travel by bus and buy your ticket ahead of time or via OVPAY CLICK HERE More information about the various transport options to Eindhoven's city centre can be found below.

Get on the bus!

Line 400

The Airport Shuttle is a fast and easy way to travel between the airport and Eindhoven's city centre. Every day of the week, the buses of line 400 leave every fifteen minutes. The bus only makes two stops along the way: at WoensXL and at BIC. The travel time between the airport and the central train station is circa twenty minutes.

Line 401

Line 401 also runs between Eindhoven Airport and Eindhoven's central train station. This line also leaves every fifteen minutes and makes more stops along the way, e.g. at P+R Meerhoven, Evoluon and Strijp-S. Together, bus lines 400 and 401 run between Eindhoven Central Station and Eindhoven Airport every seven minutes.

Get a taxi

You can get a taxi at the taxi lane next to Eindhoven Airport's main terminal. The travel time to the city centre is circa 15-20 minutes.

To and from Schiphol Airport Amsterdam

If you arrive at Schiphol, the best way to travel to Eindhoven is by train. This is the fastest and easiest way to get around in the Netherlands! Station Schiphol Airport is located directly underneath the airport itself. From the arrivals terminal, you can walk to Schiphol Plaza in just a few minutes. There, you can take the stairs, escalators or elevator down to the train platforms. You can buy your train ticket to Eindhoven online ahead of time. You will arrive in Eindhoven's city centre around ninety minutes later!

Buy your train or bus ticket with your debit or credit card

You don't have to activate anything to check in and out with your contactless debit card, credit card or smartphone. You can begin your journey immediately.



- To check in or out, take the payment card you want to use out of your wallet. Alternatively, you can use your smartphone to pay.
- Hold your card or phone against the card reader to check in.
- Important: You must use the same card to check out! It's that easy!

TRAVELLING TO EINDHOVEN BY CAR


If you want to visit Eindhoven by car, you must have a parking card for the P+R UEFA Women's Champions League Finale. These parking cards are only available through advance sale. If you do not have a parking card yet, you can buy one via this link: CLICK HERE It is not possible to park your car in the vicinity of the PSV Stadium. The address of this P+R is: Aalsterweg 316, 5644 RL Eindhoven. Shuttle buses travel between the P+R and Eindhoven's city centre. After the match, a shuttle bus will take you straight back to the P+R garage. These buses will be waiting at the end of the PSV lane, see the image below.

ORGANISED BUS TRANSPORT

If you are travelling to Eindhoven as part of an organised bus trip, your bus will park in the bus parking area on the Achtseweg Zuid. This parking area is located at walking distance from Eindhoven's city centre and the PSV Stadium. On foot, you can reach the PSV Stadium from the bus parking area in fifteen minutes. If you would rather take a bike to reach the city centre, you can use one of the shared bikes provided by TIER. You will find these bikes parked at Station Strijp S. To use a bike, you must activate the TIER app on your smartphone and add money to your account ahead of time. Note that the number of available bikes is limited. You can park your bike in the city centre and in the designated section of the bicycle parking facility near the PSV Stadium.

You can also take the train to Eindhoven's city centre. The trip from Eindhoven Strijp S to the central station takes just four minutes. This train leaves four times per hour.



WHAT TO DO IN EINDHOVEN

Eindhoven is a vibrant city full of energy and we are happy to share it with you. Try searching for the word "innovation" on Google. The first images you will see are light bulbs, which is no coincidence. More than 125 years ago, Philips literally lit up Eindhoven. The company transformed the city into an industrial success story.

Eindhoven is also a perfect example of the typical hospitality that the Dutch province of North Brabant is famous for. In Eindhoven, this hospitality is combined with a modern and industrious city. The city also has a lively craft beer culture. These beverages are served in the many cafés and restaurants that you can find all around Eindhoven. Below is an overview of the FAN hotspots that can be found in Eindhoven during the UEFA Women's Champions League Finale!

Stratumseind

This 225-metre pub street is the longest in the Benelux. It is home to more than forty cafés, many of which are open day and night. Whatever your favourite style of music may be, with so many establishments to choose from, Stratumseind has something for everyone.

Markt

Market Square is the central square in the heart of Eindhoven. This square is home to Eindhoven's large grand cafés with their expansive terraces, where you can enjoy a delicious meal and a cold beverage in the sun. The Market Square is also where you will find the Heuvel Galerie, a shopping centre with a variety of fun stores to browse around in.

Wilhelminaplein

The historical Wilhelminasquare is home to authentic cafés that have lost none of their attraction over the years. This piece of the old Eindhoven has been kept in its original condition. Visit the Wilhelminasquare to enjoy a drink or a meal on the terrace or soak up the unique atmosphere of a typical Dutch café.

Eindhoven's Top 10

- 1. Philips Museum. Philips' first light bulb factory is located in Eindhoven's inner city. This museum takes you on a journey through time: from the humble beginnings in 1891 to the innovations of tomorrow. It is absolutely worth a visit! CLICK HERE
- 2. Strijp-S. Discover the "Forbidden City." On this former Philips factory site, you can experience the transformation and redevelopment of the industrial heritage into a creative and dynamic neighbourhood.

- 4. Street-Art. Enjoy different forms of street art, such as graffiti and murals, by walking a fun route laid out by "Street Art RAW."

EINDHOVEN POLICE

Eindhoven's police department also welcomes the fans of both FC Barcelona and Vfl Wolfsburg. We hope everyone has a fun and - above all - safe stay in our city.

In Eindhoven's city centre, there is a police station at the following address: Mathildelaan 4, 5611 BL Eindhoven. On Saturday 3 June, this police station will be open until 21.00.

If you need to contact the police by phone, you can call the national number (0900-8844) and say that you want to talk to the police in Eindhoven. In case of emergency, you can call 112.

For lost and found items, you must report to the municipality of Eindhoven. Lost items can be reclaimed every working day between 08.00 and 16.00 at the Lost and Found Desk located at Vestdijk 147.

We also want to remind you to take good care of your personal belongings, because pickpockets are active on the streets of Eindhoven.

In Eindhoven's inner city, you are not allowed to drink alcohol in the street, except on a terrace. Additionally, you are not allowed to set off fireworks and/or flares on public roads. We also want to ask you not to walk around with glassware.

PSV STADIUM

The PSV Stadium is the home base of PSV. This beautiful modern stadium is located in Eindhoven's city centre, in the same location where it has always been since the club's foundation in 1913.

The PSV Stadium is generally seen as one of the most beautiful football stadiums in the Netherlands, in part because of how close the stands are to the pitch, the excellent lighting and the available facilities. On match days, the stadium can house up to 35,000 visitors.

When it comes to visiting a football match in the PSV Stadium, there are several security matters to keep in mind, the most relevant of which are listed below:

- The stadium doors will open two hours before the start of the match
- You can have your ticket scanned from your smartphone at the gate. If you purchased tickets for multiple people, everyone must be able to show their ticket on their own phone.
- You can also print out your ticket on a blank sheet of A4 paper. With a printed ticket, you can get into the stadium faster.
- The QR code on your ticket will only grant you access to the stadium once. Once it is scanned, the QR code will no longer be valid.
- If you leave the stadium for any reason, you will not be able to go back inside.
- Only buy tickets via http://womensclfinal.nl/. If you bought tickets via an unofficial sales channel, you may not be able to get into the stadium.
- If there is a problem with your ticket, you can report to the service desk at entrance 11.
- \bullet If you want to bring a bag into the stadium, it cannot be larger than A4 size (30 x 21 x 10 cm). All bags are subject to inspection. Bags, suitcases and other goods larger than A4 size are not allowed inside the stadium and will be rejected at the entrance. The stadium has a limited number of lockers where you can store larger sized bags. See the floor plan for the location of these lockers.

- Drinking alcohol (in cans or glass bottles) in the street is not allowed in Eindhoven, except on terraces. Beer is served in plastic cups.
- Drunk visitors will be denied access to or removed from the stadium.
- You are not allowed to carry or set off any fireworks in public or inside the stadium. The police will detain anyone who fails to comply with these instructions.

Pin only

Inside the PSV Stadium, you can only pay with your debit card (PIN only). You can easily pay with your debit card at the various establishments in and around the stadium. It is not possible to pay with cash or a credit card.

The following cards are accepted at the PSV Stadium:



NIX18

Inside the stadium and at the various establishments around the stadium, NO alcohol is served or sold to anyone under the age of 18. Additionally, visitors aged 18 or over are not allowed to give alcohol to visitors under the age of 18. In case of doubt, security or hospitality staff may ask to see your ID.

Deposit on food and beverage packaging

There is a ≤ 1 deposit on all cups and food packaging sold at the PSV Stadium's various establishments. This deposit will be refunded to your debit card when you return the cups or packaging. Note that it can take up to one day for the deposit to appear in your account. Any reusable cups and food packaging purchased at the various establishments around the PSV Stadium can be brought into the stadium.
